## I. Situation Overview & highlights

- On 20 July, the Office of the UN Resident/Humanitarian Coordinator in a statement noted that UN staff in Sri Lanka are not restricted from visiting hospitals in Vavuniya due to health concerns. A weekend newspaper mistakenly reported the contrary.
- On 20 July 2009, a statement posted on the official website of the Government of Sri Lanka (GoSL) stated that all persons over 60 years of age residing in IDP camps have been released. This was based on observations made by President Mahinda Rajapakse at a meeting in Mahiyanaga on 19 July.
- On 17 July, the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) closed its offices in Akkaraipattu, Batticaloa, Muttur and Trincomalee in the Eastern province. The closures follow the recent announcement that the ICRC was scaling down its operations in the country.

### *JAFFNA*

- A 'Needs Assessment and Rehabilitation Programme Formulation Team' of the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) visited Jaffna from 15 to 17 July. The main objective of the mission was to assist the GoSL to prepare a detailed rehabilitation and recovery plan for the agricultural sector and strengthen GoSL capacity and ongoing efforts to assist conflict-affected populations, and resettlement programmes.

### *VAVUNIYA*

- A five-day census was completed on 19 July involving IDPs in Menik Farm.
- Humanitarian agencies continue to report delays, occasional denial and differing procedures in accessing IDP sites in Menik Farm. It is reported that new ID cards for national staff of humanitarian agencies to enter Menik Farm are currently not being issued.

### *FUNDING*

- As of 20 July, the CHAP 2009 for Sri Lanka is 36% funded, with US\$ 93,873,920 received out of the revised mid-year requirement of \$270,055,118. In addition, \$11,972,152 has been pledged by various donors.

## II. Cluster Overview & highlights

### **SHELTER / NFI / CAMP MANAGEMENT**

- In Vavuniya, 1,151 shelters were constructed and 171 are in progress with an estimated capacity of 1,200 at the Menik Farm site 6A. Some delays were experienced during the construction due to delays in site clearing.
- In Vavuniya, Menik Farm site 6B was accepted for development following a rapid site assessment and review. Work on the site is ongoing with 31 shelters completed and 31 under construction.
- In Menik Farm site 7, construction of shelters is complete with a total of 801 shelters. The installation of WASH facilities is currently underway.
- The construction of shelters in Menik Farm site 8 has been completed with 970 tents erected.
- In Vavuniya, delays have been reported in the clearance of the 3 proposed additional sites at Chinnachippikulam.
- In Vavuniya, Technical Working Groups are being convened in the Shelter Cluster to address individual cooking in limited areas of Menik Farm zone 2. The Group will also work on contingency plans in preparation for the rainy season, maintenance of shelters, formalisation of procedures for the maintenance of current IDP locations after handover to GS / authorities and transitional shelter for returnees.
- In Vavuniya, the Shelter Cluster is leading a number of initiatives to support the agencies of the GoSL and UN partners (UNOPS and UNDP) in expediting emergency road drainage and ensuring adequate surface drainage in all zones of Menik Farm.

### **NFI**

- In Vavuniya, individual cooking is due to commence on 01 August in Menik Farm zone 4. Kitchen sets have been distributed to all families in the zone.
- In Vavuniya, following a coordination meeting between the Judicial Medical Officer (JMO), Ministry of Health (MOH) officials, WHO and other stakeholders, it was agreed to designate a focal point to lead the coordination of hospital kit distribution for in-patients at the Vavuniya GH and Poovasankulam hospitals.
- In Vavuniya on 17 July, the NFI coordination forum raised concerns over the shortage of funds to fill NFI gaps. The forum reported that only 30% of the agencies will have funds available to continue activities until the end of 2009. This will create difficulties in replacing of items due to wear and tear, providing additional hospital kits and replenishing consumable items in hygiene and baby kits.

### **WASH**

- 9,743 latrines out of a total of 15,000 required, were completed as at 18 July. In the last month alone, over 850 latrines were constructed.
- On average, a total of 4,400 cubic meters of water is currently available in all Vanni IDP sites, including 3,000 cubic meters of drinking water (10 l/person/day). However water coverage is not consistent across the zones within Menik Farm in Vavuniya, resulting in some continuing gaps and significant waits for water-collection.
- Hygiene promotion remains a concern given overcrowding of sites, difficulties in obtaining morbidity and mortality data to support interventions to mitigate water-borne disease outbreaks and insufficient suitable land to build additional latrines.

### **FOOD**

- In Vavuniya, on 16 July, the NGO Consortium supported by the Food Cluster organised a workshop to review current activities and formulate future strategies on Food distribution. Key outcomes included a decision for the Cluster to present criteria to the GA on the identification of IDP families for the provision of complementary food for individual cooking in Menik Farm zones 0, 1 and 3.
- In Vavuniya, the NGO Consortium together with the Food Cluster also decided that the supply of complementary food to community kitchens in Menik Farm zone 2 will be extended until 09 August.

## **HEALTH**

- A MOH team visited the Vavuniya hospital to assess the hospital's capacity to diagnose meningitis.
- In Vavuniya, awareness raising programmes were conducted on reproductive health and HIV/AIDS in camps for people of reproductive age.
- Facilities for obstetric care were strengthened at the Base Hospital in Cheddikulam through the appointment of a permanent specialist Visiting Obstetrician and Gynecologist (VOG) and the provision of two ultrasound scanners to the Health Coordination Centre in Menik Farm.
- In Vavuniya, the incidence of communicable diseases, such as hepatitis, chickenpox, typhoid, diarrhea, has declined over the past week.
- The MOH appointed 29 new doctors to serve on a permanent basis in all IDP zones in the district.
- In Vavuniya, psychiatrists and Community Support Officers (CSO) are providing mental health and psychosocial support services in all IDP zones
- The MOH and partners are preparing for the provision of healthcare services for new IDP sites that are planned as part of the decongestion of existing camps.

## **EDUCATION**

- Out of the 90,000 IDP children requiring safe and secure learning spaces, approximately 40,000 children are currently participating in education in 235 Temporary Learning Spaces (TLS) in Menik Farm, Jaffna and Trincomalee. A further 10,400 will benefit when 52 TLS are completed within the next few weeks. The construction of another 150 TLS is in the pipeline to benefit 30,000 additional children.
- There is a need to enhance the quality of education in the temporary classrooms, by providing reading corners, book boxes and training to teaching staff. Discussions are ongoing to formulate alternative, accelerated education programmes.
- The Education Cluster has identified a need for a comprehensive Education Management Information System (EMIS) in all IDP districts, to manage and disseminate information.

## **CHILD PROTECTION**

- In Vavuniya, two Child Friendly Spaces (CFS) were established in blocks 3 and 4 of Menik Farm zone 4 and recreational material was provided.
- In Vavuniya, discussions took place between the Shelter Cluster, the GA and local authorities to establish Child Focus Centres in IDP sites. The first pilot Child Focus Centre is expected to be completed shortly in block 28 of Menik Farm zone 3. The Child Focus Centre will be run by representatives of the following agencies: Probation Office (in charge of legal issues, such as the care of unaccompanied and/or separated minors), DCDC/NCPA (National Child Protection Authority, the child protection coordination body), Ministry of Social Services (in charge of psychosocial counselling and disability issues), Child Rights Promotion Officers (CRPO) in charge of identification and referral of vulnerable children and Police 'Women and Children's desks'.

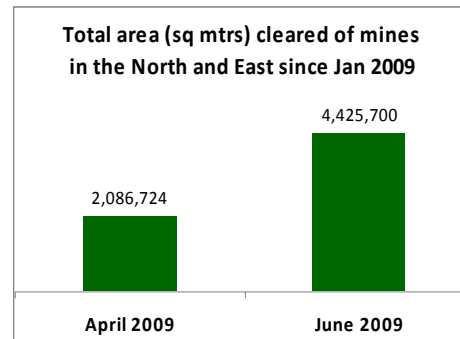
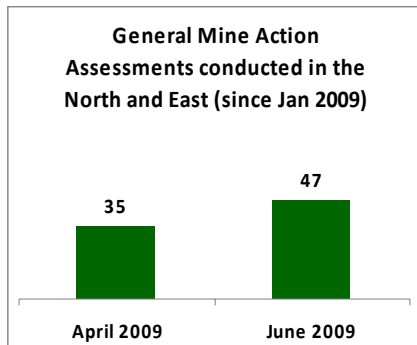
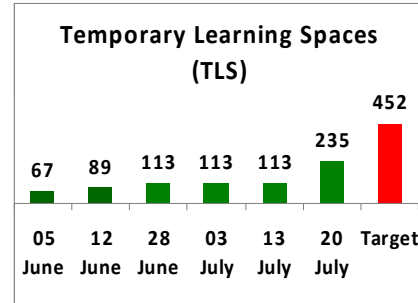
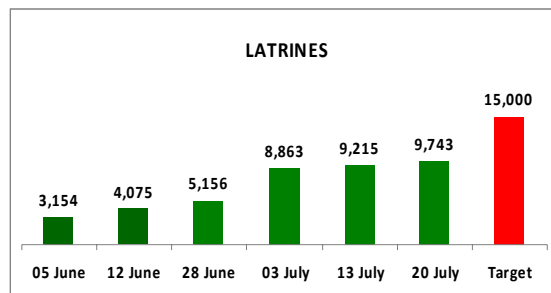
## **MINE ACTION**

- On 13 July, the GoSL communicated its intent to task INGOs, specialized in demining, with mine survey and clearance work in Punakeri, Karachchi, and areas west of the A9 road in the Kilinochchi district. This is a significant development in mine action policy since demining was suspended in Kilinochchi in December 2007.
- New mine/UXO survey and clearance tasks have been issued in Mahaoya in the Ampara district and in Horowpathana, Padawiya, Kabathigollawa and Mahavilachchiya in the Anuradhapura district.
- The Sri Lanka Army Humanitarian Demining Unit cleared 22km of the A32 road along the Northwestern coast in Mannar.

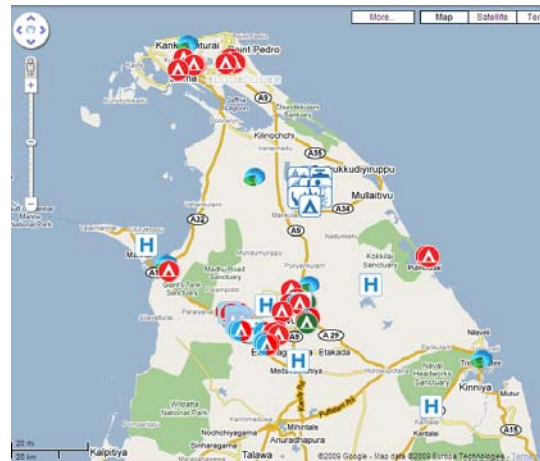
## CLUSTERS' RESPONSE TO THE IDP SITUATION SINCE OCTOBER 2008
