I. Situation Overview & highlights

- On 27 July, the inaugural flight of the Sri Lanka Air Force's (SLAF) service for civilian passengers to Palaly, Jaffna, took off from Colombo. The flights to Jaffna will take off from Ratmalana airport on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. Domestic flights to Trincomalee and Sigiriya will commence shortly.
- The Sri Lankan Foreign Minister Rohitha Bogollagama said recently that 60% of Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) would return home within the 180-day plan announced by the President in May, not the earlier expected 80%. The Foreign Minister said Sri Lanka would need extra time to resettle more than 280,000 IDPs, adding that logistics, including landmine clearance, were a factor in the delay.
- On 25 July, Eric P. Schwartz, the newly appointed United States Assistant Secretary of State for Population, Refugees and Migration, arrived in Sri Lanka. During his stay, he will visit IDP camps in the north and meet with senior Government officials and civil society representatives.

VAVUNIYA

- On 23 July, the Vavuniya Government Agent (GA) announced that on 28 July a meeting with all Zonal Commanders and organisational heads will take place to discuss issues of access to IDP sites within Vavuniya District.
- On 24 July, UNHCR was informed that the Government of Sri Lanka (GoSL) plans to begin the third phase of IDP relocation to Katkulam village. This phase targets 500 families currently at Poonthoddam Welfare Centre and 600 families from Sidhambarapuram Welfare Centres.
- Government officials in Vavuniya have suggested that arrangements are being made to initiate the return of more than 5,000 families originally from 9 villages in the Poonakary and Karachchi Grama Niladhari divisions in the coming weeks.

TRINCOMALEE

- This week, the vehicle registration process at the Sangama checkpoint (6th milepost), for vehicles exiting Trincomalee on the Trincomalee-Kandy road, was discontinued. Since 2006, all vehicles leaving Trincomalee (except those of the UN) were required to record the names and identity card numbers of their passengers, as well as vehicle engine and chassis numbers, at this checkpoint.

FUNDING

- As of 27 July, the Common Humanitarian Action Plan (CHAP) 2009 for Sri Lanka is 40% funded, with US\$93,873,920 received out of the revised mid-year requirement of \$270,055,118. In addition, \$11,706,900 has been pledged by various donors.
- On 23 July, the GoSL stated that the Government of the Russian Federation had announced a contribution of US\$500,000 for UNHCR programmes in Sri Lanka aimed at addressing current humanitarian needs.
- On 22 July, UNHCR acknowledged a donation of US\$50,000 from the Government of Brazil towards responding to non-food needs of IDPs, especially women and children, displaced during the final months of conflict.

II. Cluster Overview & highlights

SHELTER / NFI / CAMP MANAGEMENT

- The Sri Lanka Army (SLA) is setting up several small sites on the Pampaimadu campus grounds, Vavuniya, to accommodate surrendered ex-cadres of the LTTE.
- As of 23 July, Menik Farm site 6A was 95% complete, with 1,359 shelters constructed and a further 10 in progress, while 143 shelters were complete and 152 under construction on site 6B.
- The SLA is in the process of subdividing Menik Farm Zone 4 into two zones with fencing. The new Zone 4A will include sectors a, b, c and blocks d2-d8. Zone 4B includes sectors e, f and blocks d0 and 1.
- The strengthening of shelters in Menik Farm Zone 3, to reduce the need for frequent maintenance and the risk of damage due to high winds, is almost complete.
- On 22 July, a Technical Working Group (TWG) meeting on Contingency Preparation for the Wind and Rains took place in Vavuniya. The TWG recognised that there is only a very limited range of feasible options to temporarily relocate IDPs (inside and outside the existing camps), in case of large-scale damage to tents / shelters or flooding. Therefore, strengthening (not upgrading) existing temporary shelters and completion of drains is an absolute necessity.
- The Road Development Department (RDD) has completed approximately 50% of road drainage work in Menik Farm Zone 1, while the United Nations Office for Project Services (UNOPS) has started drainage work in Zone 2.
- The Shelter Cluster continues to advocate that agencies undertake operations as per the Aide Memoire. Two agencies operating outside the Cluster structure have recently started construction of nearly 700 semi-permanent shelters in Zone 5 (tent site).

FOOD

- This week the Food Cluster focused on finalising a vulnerability survey to determine which IDPs are eligible for complementary food.
- Sarvodaya Economic Enterprise Development Services (SEEDS), World Vision International (WVI), German Red Cross (GRC) and FORUT are shortly to address the standardisation of items and nutritional values of the complementary food baskets to the extremely vulnerable.
- The World Food Programme (WFP) is negotiating with CARITAS to assume responsibility for food storage and delivery, as well as communal cooking, in the Sumathipuram, Tharmapuram and Veerapuram IDP sites in Vavuniya.
- Eleven items mostly spices, are included in the next Indian government donation to IDP Welfare Centers. No details on delivery date are available yet.
- The Regional Directorate of Health Services (RDHS) and WFP have identified NGOs to provide blanket supplementary feeding to 35-40,000 beneficiaries (pregnant, lactating women, children under 5) in all zones of Menik Farm, plus the Sumathipuram, Tharmapuram and Veerapuram sites.
- WFP plans to start family food distribution on 29 July in Zone 4. Food commodities for 14 days will be distributed in Zones 1 and 4 during or before the first week of August.
- There is a possibility of a break in the pipeline in the distribution of the WFP basic food basket by the end of September. Without further donations, certain commodities will run out.
- Between 1- 22 July, WFP had distributed 2,425.119 Mt of basic food commodities to IDPs in Vavuniya.

HEALTH

- Preliminary work has started to establish permanent Reproductive Health (RH) clinics at Menik Farm.
- On 25 July, the Director General of Health Services visited the Cheddikulam IDP sites on a monitoring mission.
- On 27 July, a team from the Emergency Coordination Unit of the Ministry of Healthcare and Nutrition will undertake a mission to Menik Farm.

- During last week's coordination meeting of the Health Cluster in Vavuniya, it was agreed to prepare contingency plans for three scenarios, (1) establishment of new smaller IDP sites; (2) IDP resettlement; and (3) monsoon consequences and the necessary increased provision of services as a response.
- With the help of the Medical Officer of Health (MOH) / RDHS, 4,000 field personnel, including food-handlers working on the sites and health staff, have been vaccinated.
- The profile reviewing process for Health Promoters in Zones 4 A and B, supported by the Sri Lanka Red Cross Society (SLRCS) / Canadian Red Cross, was finalized. It will be shared with the Supervising Public Health Midwife (SPHM) / MoH / Health Education Bureau.

PROTECTION

- On 22 July, the Minister of Disaster Management and Human Rights, Mahinda Samarasinghe, visited Menik Farm and met with local Government authorities and humanitarian partners. Progress on the framework for the rehabilitation of former combatants and the establishment of Community Services Centers in all zones was discussed.
- Protection staff report that inconsistent access to IDP sites and the need to surrender their NICs at the entrance continue to restrict their work.
- IDP transfers between Menik Farm sites continue. All town sites are reportedly to be vacated by the end of the month to allow schools to reopen.
- Family reunification across IDP sites within Vavuniya and between sites in Vavuniya and Mannar Districts is ongoing. It is yet to begin for IDPs in Pulmoddai, Trincomalee. Government officials state that so far some 5,000 families have been reunited.
- IDPs are now allowed to move between Zones 2 and 3 to visit friends and relatives.
- Elderly IDPs continue to be released from Menik Farm to friends and relatives. So far, 1,308 persons have been released in Zone 2 (35% of the total registered for release); 1,113 persons have been released in Zone 3 (53.3% of the total registered); and 428 persons have been released in Zone 4 (25% of the total registered). Additional requests for release are also being registered regularly. Government officials report that approximately 9,000 IDPs, including pregnant mothers, elderly and children, have been released so far.
- Postal services began one week ago in Veerapuram and Tharmapuram IDP sites, Vavuniya.

CHILD PROTECTION

- The police investigation among surrendered ex-child combatants of the LTTE at the Poonthoddam cooperative training centre, Vavuniya, has been completed for boys and is ongoing for girls. The Protection Cluster continues to highlight the need for the services of a female doctor for a number of pregnant girls at the camp.

MINE ACTION

- Demining operators report that the lack of definite information on where mines have been laid delays clearance and resettlement in nearly 100 dangerous areas in Vavuniya North and Manthai West.

LOGISTICS

- In Colombo, on 15 July, the Logistics Cluster was revived with its first meeting for 2009. Cluster meetings will be held at the Colombo level on a monthly basis.
- In Vavuniya, on 22 July, the Logistics Cluster decided to meet on a fortnightly basis, given the rapid changes at operational level.
